



**THE CITY OF LEON VALLEY
HIKE & BIKE TRAIL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING**

The Hike and Bike Trail Advisory Committee of the City of Leon Valley, Texas met on the 9th day of April, 2019, at 6:30 p.m., at Leon Valley City Hall, 6400 El Verde Road, Leon Valley, Texas, for the purpose of the following business, to-wit:

1. Call to order, Pledge of Allegiance and Determine if Quorum is Present

Chairman Matthew Hodde called the Hike and Bike Trail Advisory Committee meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Present were Vice-Chairman Henry Diecker, and Members Josue de la Torre, Roger Christensen, Ray Hendricks, Diana Frazier, and Darby Riley. Also present was Staff Liaison Melinda Moritz. Absent were Members Cynthia Koger and Belinda Benavidez.

2. Consider Approval of the January 14, 2019 Hike & Bike Trail Advisory Committee regular meeting minutes.

Committee Member Christensen made a motion to approve the minutes as written, which was seconded by Member Riley. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Discussion – Proposed Hike and Bike Trail Alignment, From Bandera to Evers Road.

Staff Liaison Moritz gave a brief review of the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organizations' CMAQ grant Technical Review Committee meeting. She noted that the emphasis was on a reduction in emissions and that the trail project would probably not be chosen.

Chairman Hodde informed the Members that the City Council had heard this item at their January 2019 Town Hall meeting and that the citizens had voted in favor of placing the trail inside the fire break at the Huebner-Onion Natural Area Park. The Committee Members held a general discussion on the trail to include the distance from the homes along Evening Sun and Red Jacket, the concrete trail under the Bandera Road bridge, and the erosion in the creek.


4. Other Business.

Chairman Hodde asked the Committee Members whom they thought should be nominated to the Committee, as Member Belinda Benavidez was not able to attend the meetings anymore. He also noted that he was getting some negative feedback on the


alignment of the trail along El Verde Road, stating that neighbors had commented on the trail being too close to El Verde Road. A general discussion was held on altering the alignment, the proposed plantings, fencing, and trees.
