



**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
LEON VALLEY POOL ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Meeting of the Leon Valley Pool Advisory Committee at 6:00 PM, on Wednesday, June 26, 2019, at the Forest Oaks Pool (Meeting Room), 6620 Forest Grove, Leon Valley, Texas.

I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Members Present: Stacey Norris, Carolyn Diaz, Raymond Diaz, Ashley Acevedo, Jan Todd, and Kerin Friedeck

Staff: David Dimaline, Public Works Assistant Director, Aaron Holland, President and General Manager of San Antonio Pool Management

II. Approval of Minutes of the May 9, 2019 Meeting

The minutes were reviewed and approved. Ms. Friedeck moved to approve the minutes, and Ms. Todd seconded.

III. Reports:

A. Status of Pools and Preparations for Opening

David Dimaline reported that total revenue collected to date was \$19,649.20. This includes season passes, gate fees, and concessions. A total of 95 applications have been received at City Hall totaling 340 people. A breakdown of revenue is as follows:

Season Passes: \$11,040

Concession and Gate Fees: \$8,609.20

- \$4,175 makes up the gate fees; a total of 835 people have paid the gate fee since the opening.

There has only been one complaint received on opening weekend regarding cloudy water. This may have been a result of some concrete shavings left from replacing the skimmers at the Forest Oaks Pool. The message was passed along to San Antonio Pool Management. There have been no complaints received since this one. The City also received compliments on water quality and how nice the pools look.

There have been some minor repairs made by the City such as a toilet replacement and a door handle.

Aaron Holland, President and General Manager of San Antonio Pool Management introduced himself and made himself available for any questions. Committee members asked about the fence surrounding the Forest Oaks Pool, and asked if a wrought iron fence could be constructed. The banner on the privacy fence came loose and is hanging on the ground, and the question of how many pool parties had there been.

David Dimaline reported that there was no money in this year's budget to replace fencing. Quite a few repairs had to be made to address the leaks at the Forest Oaks pool. Mr. Holland said that to date, twelve parties have been scheduled.

General discussion began on when to schedule the next meeting, and it was decided the Committee will meet next on July 31, 2019.

IV. Adjournment

Mr. Diaz moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was Seconded by Ms. Friedeck, and the motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
