

Q: What can be done to help control mosquitos in my neighborhood?

A: Public Works does not routinely spray for mosquitos. We typically wait to receive at least three calls from citizens in any given area before a pesticide spray is scheduled. Citizens can help reduce the number of mosquitoes by keeping swimming pools clean and water circulated as well as dumping any standing water on your property.

Q: We see a lot of dogs out without a leash on and pet owners that are not cleaning up after their pets? Do we have any regulations on this?

A: The City has recently hired an Animal Control person to enforce ordinances that the City has in place regulating animals within the City of Leon Valley.

Q: There is a feral cat problem on my street with one house apparently feeding the cats. What can I do?

A: The City Council enacted a feral cat program that authorizes residents to maintain a feral cat colony. If the colony is negatively impacting another resident, the City will step in and rectify the issue.
