The Edwards Aquifer has fallen below 650 feet above sea level, therefore Stage II mandatory water conservation, is now declared to be in effect. All Leon Valley water customers are required to comply with the following conservation measures:

Landscape Watering with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose is allowed only once per week (in accordance with Stage I watering days) only between the hours of 3 a.m. to 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. to 10 p.m., as determined by your address. Please see the chart with the last number of address and watering day indicated. Areas without a street address, such as medians and neighborhood entryways, water on Wednesday.

Last Number of Your Address	Watering Day
0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday
Apartment complexes, businesses, schools, churches, commercial users	Wednesday

Watering with a hand held hose is allowed any time on any day.

Swimming Pools: Makeup for existing facilities is permitted. Draining is prohibited except onto pervious surfaces only. All swimming pools must have an effective evaporation cover or screen, or evaporation shields covering at least 25% of the pool surface.

Aesthetic Use: Water used for fountains and other decorative facilities is prohibited except with reused water.

Washing of impervious surface areas, such as sidewalks and driveways is prohibited except washing for immediate health and safety concerns. Washing of vehicles is prohibited except on designated days with hand held hose or bucket.

All water customers should heed the public announcements by the City of San Antonio, as they apply in a like manner in the City of Leon Valley. All violations are subject up to a \$2,000 fine.
