

Councilman Jordan has been a proud citizen of Leon Valley, since August of 2012. He is currently serving his second term, His first term was served as Mayor Pro-Tem, Councilor Place 5. As a community servant, Councilman Jordan reflects the values of the families he represents by increasing public safety, supporting our first responders, fostering sound business and economic development practices, investing in infrastructure and neighborhoods, increasing job opportunities, enhancing our green spaces and servicing our senior and youth populations. There, he authored Air Force law & order directives, and provided force protection guidance, policies and procedures to 175 Air Force installations assisting over twenty-five thousand security forces members. Councilman Jordan became a decorated combat veteran, while serving multiple tours in Bosnia Herzegovina, Baghdad and Balad Iraq and South East Asia in support of Operations Deliberate Force, Joint Forge, Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom and New Dawn.

Councilman Jordan has a proud history of serving our local civic and non-profit communities. He served on the Leon Valley's, Planning and Zoning Commission, Crime Control District, Police Citizens Advisory Committee and Economic Development Committee. He is the former president of his home owner's association (HOA) and is a proud member of The American Legion Post #336. Councilman Jordan is Founder of My Fathers Table Food Bank at Faith Worship Center Church, San Antonio, Texas.

He also serves with the South Texas Alliance for Orphans, Vice Chairman of Voices For Children of San Antonio, and the Community Advisory Group.

Through the benefits of the Montgomery GI Bill, David is a candidate for a Master's Degree in Public Administration (MPA) with a certification in administration and leadership in non-profit organizations from University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), 2019.
