The Leon Valley Historical Society is dedicated to researching, documenting and commemorating the heritage and history of Leon Valley and surrounding areas. Currently, we are investigating and restoring the Huebner-Onion Homestead, a two-story structure along Bandera Road that dates back to the 1850s. The Historical Society also leasing the 36 acres of land adjacent to the homestead and developing trails with the goal of keeping it a natural area. The Homestead is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and received its Historical Marker in May, 2008. Additional funding is being sought to prepare the 36-acre Leon Valley Huebner-Onion Natural Area for outdoor classrooms and self-guided nature tours relating to the wildlife, birds, native plant species and butterfly habitats within the area. The Leon Valley Historical Society has permanent status as a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization; contributions are tax deductible.

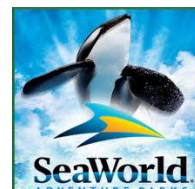

The San Antonio Public Library is a collection of a Central Library and 24 branch libraries (as of the fall of 2008) that serve the City of San Antonio. The library serves other cities in the area including Alamo Heights, Hill Country Village, and Olmos Park. The Central Library is a 240,000-square-foot six-story structure that opened in 1995 in Downtown San Antonio. The building is easily recognized by its bright-colored, striking Mexican Modernist design. The primary color of the building's exterior is "Enchilada Red". The architect for the building was selected by a design competition held by the City in July 1991.

The Casa Navarro State Historic Site is nestled in downtown San Antonio. The half-acre site is the restored home of Tejano patriot José Antonio Navarro (1795–1871). Today, visitors can tour Navarro's adobe home furnished with period antiques, read copies of his writing, and discuss questions of history with informed interpreters. The original house complex consisted of three limestone, caliche block, and adobe structures, built about 1848. Casa Navarro is the only historic site in San Antonio dedicated to the interpretation of the Mexican history and heritage of Texas, as seen through the life of Navarro, a prominent San Antonio merchant, rancher and statesman.

The Spanish Governor's Palace is a National Historic Landmark in the city of San Antonio, Texas. Built in the first half of the eighteenth century, it was originally intended to protect the nearby San Antonio de Valero Mission (the Alamo) and the growing colony. It is considered the sole remaining example of an aristocratic early Spanish house in Texas. The National Geographic Society has called the landmark "the most beautiful building in San Antonio." The building was constructed in the early eighteenth century, possibly as early as 1722. The keystone above the front entrance is marked with the coat-of-arms of Spanish King Ferdinand VI along with the date 1749. Come see where Spain had its first permanent military presence in San Antonio. Come learn Texas' earliest history under Spanish rule. Come and be delightfully surprised at the beautifully landscaped gardens in the courtyard. You won't want to leave.

From its founding on March 9, 1731 by a group of 15 (fifteen) families who came from the Canary Islands at the invitation of King Phillip V of Spain, this church was planned to be at the center of the life of this city. The Cathedral of San Fernando is a cathedral of the Roman Catholic Church located in San Antonio, Texas. It is the mother church of the Archdiocese of San Antonio and the seat of its archbishop. The cathedral is also listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is notable as the oldest cathedral in the United States. San Fernando Cathedral functions not exclusively as a Catholic Cathedral, but as a center of unity and harmony for all the God-loving people of San Antonio and beyond.

The gardens opened in an abandoned limestone rock quarry in the early 20th century. The Japanese Tea Garden is a public park with more than 90 years of rich history. Located near Brackenridge Park and the San Antonio Zoo, the Japanese Tea Garden is quiet, shaded, and lush with exotic vegetation. It contains a large open-air pagoda, sprawling koi ponds, and a waterfall. The City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Parks Foundation are pleased to make this beautiful space available for your next special event.

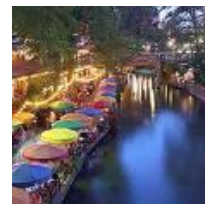


The Majestic Theatre is San Antonio's oldest and largest atmospheric theatre. In 1975, the theatre was listed on the National Register of Historical Places and was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1993. The theatre has been home to the San Antonio Symphony since 1989. The theatre seats 2,311 people and was designed by architect John Eberson for Karl Hoblitzelle's Interstate Theatres in 1929. For many years it remained the largest theatre in Texas and the second largest movie theatre in the United States. It was also the first theatre in the state to be totally air-conditioned.

San Antonio Conservation Society rescued the Aztec in 1988 and by 1992, succeeded in having it listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Epic in scale and awesome to behold, this architectural marvel is now Aztec on the River, a premiere destination for downtown visitors and the crown jewel of the world renowned San Antonio River Walk. Meticulously restored to its former glory, this grand venue serves as a reminder of a time when style, artistry, and craftsmanship where the essential elements of building design. It is also ideal as a multifaceted entertainment venue, easily adaptable into a special events space, performing arts center, live music venue, retail space, or any combination thereof. 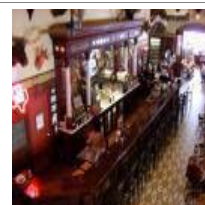

What is now known as the San Antonio Zoo began in 1914 when Colonel George W. Brackenridge, one of the city's leading citizens, placed bison, deer, monkeys, lions, and bears on land he had deeded to the City. The land became Brackenridge Park and Golf Course. The San Antonio Zoo opened two of the first cage-less exhibits in America in November 1929 which offered visitors views of the animals not available in caged exhibits. The Richard Friedrich Aquarium was dedicated in 1948.

The 56-acre zoo has a collection of over 3,500 animals representing 750 species; which is one of the largest animal collections in the United States. The San Antonio Zoo is considered one of the top facilities in the country because of its conservation efforts and its successful breeding programs (it produced the first white rhino in the U.S.). The zoo's annual attendance exceeds 850,000.

The Friedrich Aquarium is one of the Zoo's most popular exhibits with 24 tanks of variety tropical fish. There's a lot to see such as chocolate chip starfish and pencil urchins in the Octopus exhibit to Bamboo and bonnet head sharks to a variety of eels and seahorses. Other favorites are piranhas, archerfish, moon jellyfish, the venomous lionfish, and the alligator snapping turtle (estimated to be at least 40 to 50 years old).

Located just below the headwaters of the San Antonio River, Brackenridge Park and has been a gathering place since prehistoric times. There is evidence of human visitation and occupation extending back at least 11,000 years. Native American artifacts have been found in the Olmos Basin and near Hildebrand Avenue. Brackenridge Park is a focal point for outdoor family activities. The picturesque San Antonio River, which originates from artesian springs north of the park, meanders by paved, tree-lined paths suitable for bicycling and walking. Additional recreational opportunities include picnicking, pedal boating, fishing, birding and nature study. Facilities include athletic fields, playground, concessions and a 3.5-mile miniature railway. Brackenridge Golf Course is the oldest municipal golf course in Texas and is located within the park. Today, Brackenridge Park is one of San Antonio's most accessible, relaxing and varied recreational destinations.
