Tier I Boards & Commissions *Statutory Boards, Commissions and Corporations (Policy Making Authority)*

Board of Adjustment: Retains the power to review and approve variances from zoning ordinance requirements. Meetings called as needed on Monday evenings at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

Leon Valley Economic Development Corporation: Supports and may fund projects which promote new or expanded business enterprises that increase the tax base and improve the quality of life of Leon Valley. Meetings are held on the fourth Wednesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

Zoning Commission: Acts as an advisory board to the City Council on land use and zoning matters. Meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

Tier II Boards & Commissions *Standing Advisory Boards*

Library Board of Trustees: Members meet the second Monday of each month in the Library at 7:00 p.m. to discuss Library projects, plans, and policies.

Park Commission: Makes recommendations to the City Council regarding park ordinances and policies, and serves as the City Parks liaison to the public. Meetings held on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Tree Advisory Board: Oversees the Leon Valley Tree Challenge to plant 10,000 trees by the year 2020. Meetings held at 6:30 p.m. in Council Chambers on the 3rd Wednesday of the month.

Bandera Road Site - Community Advisory Group: Meets quarterly to listen to updates from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) about the contaminate water plume in the City. Quarterly meetings held at 5:30 p.m. at the Leon Valley Conference Center.

Tier III Boards & Commissions These standing and ad-hoc committees are called upon for a specific task or project. Committees that fall under this Tier could automatically dissolve/sunset upon completion of its charge, or the time prescribed by the City Council.

Earthwise Living Committee: Provides community education to assist in learning to live a sustainable way of life in harmony with the natural surroundings. The EWLC sponsors and coordinates the annual Earthwise Living Day held on the last Saturday in February. Meetings are held on the second Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. at the Public Works Service Center off Evers Road.

Community Events Committee: Provides volunteer support and coordination for the various City-sponsored civic events such as the 4th of July Celebration, the Beautification Awards Program, the Grandparents' Day Concert, and the Holiday Lighting Program. Meetings held the third Wednesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Conference Center.

Communications Committee: Works to determine the best uses of the City's resources for enhanced communications for recommendation to the City Council.

Branding/Identity Committee: Works to determine the City's branding, logos, and identity for recommendation to the City Council.

Festival(s) Committee: Works to determine and define options for future City Festivals for recommendation to the City Council

Business Managers' and Owners' Alliance Committee (BOMA): Acts as a business advisory committee to City Council and local businesses on business-related topics. *This committee is currently inactive.*
