If you're eligible to get vaccinated now, below is a list of large vaccination hubs and/or local vaccine providers that are distributing COVID-19 Vaccines. ### **When searching for a vaccination site, remember:**

- Vaccine supply is limited. Not all local providers have vaccine each week and hubs may have long waiting lists.
- Do not show up at a hub or provider looking for a vaccine.
- Instead, check the provider's website. Call only if the website doesn't answer your questions.

### **City of San Antonio (Metro Health)**

- The City of San Antonio is providing initial vaccinations to those most at risk of exposure to COVID-19. Individuals have been placed in two groups, designated as Phase 1A and 1B. ### **WellMed - COVID-19 Vaccination Reservation Hotline Opening Feb. 9, 2021.**

- The phone number to get an appointment is 833-968-1745.
- The reservation hotline for two community vaccination clinics operated by WellMed in San Antonio will re-open to take appointments at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 9, 2021. Appointments will begin Feb. 10.
- Operators will take calls from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. starting Feb. 9 every day until reservations are booked for all supply in stock.
- You must call this number to get an appointment. No other phone number or online registration method is being used to set appointments at these clinics.

## **CVS Pharmacies**

- As the COVID-19 vaccine continues to roll out across Texas CVS Health announced it will also help meet increasing demands to administer shots. Starting next Thursday, Feb. 11, 70 CVS pharmacies across Texas will start to offer COVID-19 vaccinations. The [appointments](#) will become available as early as Tuesday.
- Appointments will be available to book online at [CVS.com](https://www.cvs.com) or through the CVS app starting Feb. 11. People without online access can call the customer service line at 800-746-7287 to schedule an appointment beginning on that date. Walk-in appointments will not be provided.
