Presentation, Discussion and Possible Action on Options for the City Leon Valley's July 4th, 2018 Event (M&C # 2018-01-23-04 S. Passailaigue)

City Secretary Saundra Passailaigue gave a brief presentation on options for Leon Valley's 2018 July 4 celebration.

Council Member Belinda Ealy said she liked the idea of Soap Box Derby but thought the location might be a problem.

Council Member Monica Alcocer suggested a break in the event from noon to 5:00 p.m. during the heat of the day.

- Tina Chasan suggested a dunking booth and to hold a dog/cat adoption during the event.
- Amber Mouser suggested that the firefighters collect donations to offset the cost of the event.
- Tina Chasan then suggested partnering up with the Aquarium and stated that she likes an all-day event opposed to a shortened event.

There was a consensus among members of City Council to split the event with morning and evening events but to have some water events at the pools perhaps during the heat of the day.

Discuss and Consider Possible Action on a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Leon Valley Ordering and Establishing Procedures for a General Election in the City of Leon Valley, Texas to Elect Three Council Members: (Places 2, 4 and for the Office of the Mayor) by the Qualified Voters of the City of Leon Valley; Authorizing the City Manager to Sign a Joint Election Agreement with the Bexar County Elections Administrator for the Conduct of Said Election, and Providing Details Relating to the Conduct of Holding the Election, Authorizing the Use of the Leon Valley Conference Center, Located at 6421 Evers Road, Leon Valley, Texas, 78238, for Early Voting (April 23, 2018 through May 01, 2018) and on the 5th day of May, 2018, for Election Day Voting.

City Secretary Saundra Passailaigue presented a proposed resolution ordering a General Election in the City of Leon Valley, Texas, to be held on May 5, 2018, for the election of a three Council Members: Places 2, 4 and for the Office of the Mayor to be held for the City of Leon Valley; and designating Jacquelyn F. Callanen, Bexar County Elections Administrator, as the Election Administrator to conduct such election.

Discussion and Possible Action on a 2nd Reading of an Ordinance the Establishment and Implementation of a Program to Charge Mitigation Rates for The Deployment of Emergency and Non-Emergency Services by The Leon Valley Fire Department; And Authorizing the City Manager to Negotiate and Execute an Agreement with Fire Recovery USA, LLC For Billing and Collection Services. (1st Reading was held on January 23rd) (M&C # 2018-02-06-04 L. Valdez)

Chief Luis Valdez presented the item proposing that the City of Leon Valley enter into a contractual agreement with a vendor that provides billing services to over 200 cities in Texas, Fire Recovery USA, LLC for billing the at-fault party's (residents and non-residents) insurance company for the Leon Valley Fire Department's services, and use of equipment and materials in response to motor vehicle collisions.

On average, the fire department responds to 200 vehicle accidents per year. Besides patient care, service provided by the fire department include; traffic control, vehicle stabilization, extrication, hazardous materials fluid spills, disconnection of battery cables, removal of hazards and clearing debris from the roadway. The fire department currently does not bill for providing these services.

The fire department's electronic reporting software system is compatible with that of Fire Recovery USA, LLC. Information related to the incident may be automatically extracted and processed from Fire Recovery USA, LLC. All billing and collection correspondence and activities will comply with a format and standards acceptable to the City and in accordance with all applicable Federal, State or local laws.

Under the contract, the City of Leon Valley will receive 80 percent of the claim revenue collected by the company. The remaining 20 percent is retained by Fire Recovery, USA which represents their fee for providing the billing and collection services. The company will process and remit funds to the City on a monthly basis within seven working days after the close and accounting of each billing cycle. The company will also provide a status report on all active claims monthly.

Fire Recovery, USA will also provide training to ensure that City Staff is capable of responding to customer inquiries regarding billing, complaints, and contact information, as well as logging into the company's system to check the status of claims and run other informational reports.

The term of this contract is suggested for five years with an optional extension period of five years based upon City Council approval.

Police Chief Joseph Salvaggio presented this item with the purpose of proposing an amendment to: allow the City the latitude to remove nuisance vehicles from public and private property in a timelier manner: better define what a junked vehicle is, and where they can and cannot be stored; and to allow the City the discretion to demolish or auction abandoned/junk vehicles in a manner that is in the best interest of the citizens of Leon Valley.

Police Chief Joseph Salvaggio presented this amending ordinance in an effort to: meet new changes to Ordinance 08-008 Junked Vehicles; change storage requirements before auction to meet the State law; allow the City the discretion to put the vehicles into use for the City; and give the Chief or City Manager the discretion to waive towing fees.

Council asked that the ordinance clarify the twenty-one (21) days and whether or not that was business days or calendar days; a list of objective criteria for waivers; victims of crimes or what?

Community Development Director Nina Nixon-Mendez presented this ordinance to amend the City of Leon Valley Code of Ordinances, Chapter 14 Utilities, Article 14.02 Solid Waste, Division 2. Collection, Section 14.02.036 Containers and Section 14.02.037 Placement of Waste for Collection to update solid waste and recycling collection standards.

This section of the code was last updated in 2008. It is now necessary to update the code regarding the city's solid waste and recycling collection standards to be in accordance with industry standards.
