Presentation, Public Hearing, and Discussion of an Ordinance Amending Section 15.02.722, of the City of Leon Valley Code of Ordinances, Regarding Procedures of the Board of Adjustment and Criteria for Evaluating Requests for Appeals, Special Exceptions, and Variances. (1st Reading was held on 11-20-18) (M&C # 2018-12-04-06 B. Melland)

Planning & Zoning Director Brandon Melland presented this item to amend Section 15.02.722 of the City's Zoning Code regarding findings of the board in making motions and the criteria for evaluating special exceptions, variances, and appeals to the Board of Adjustment. Currently Sections 15.02.722(t) and Section 15.02.722(cc) of the zoning code regulate the criteria and findings for considering such requests. However, several of these findings and criteria are not objective or quantitative, and are difficult to evaluate and apply at both a Staff and Board level.

Director Melland concluded his presentation saying that Staff recommends amending these findings and criteria in order to provide Staff the ability to perform more focused analysis and recommendations on requests, and provide the Board more direction in granting and approving requests.

Special Events/Community Center Manager Maribel Mendoza presented this item on behalf of John Marshall High School who is requesting an In-Kind Grant for use of the Leon Valley Community Center on Friday, December 21, 2018, for their Ram Band Winter Dance. They were scheduled to have the dance at their cafeteria but it is currently under construction, which took longer than expected to complete. Because the band believed their dance would be held in the school's cafeteria, they did not budget for a facility rental for their winter dance. This is their first request for assistance under the In-Kind Grant Program. They've volunteered and participated in many City events, such as the Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony, Veterans Day Bridge Dedication and 4th of July Parade. Presentation and Discussion to Consider Approving an Ordinance Authorizing the Purchase of an LED Monochromatic Sign to Replace the Current Changeable Copy Sign at the City of Leon Valley Library (1st Reading as Required by City Charter) (M&C # 2018-12-04-13 M. Moritz)

Public Works Director Melinda Moritz presented this item seeking City Council approval of an ordinance authorizing the purchase of an LED monochromatic informational sign to be located at the Leon Valley Library. The library currently has a changeable copy message board that has to be hand changed every Friday, which takes Public Works employees about an hour or more to complete. Council budgeted funds to replace the sign this year, as the rails that hold the letters are missing in some places and the sign is very old and dilapidated. In addition, the sign is a pole sign, which is no longer allowed in this area and will be replaced with a code compliant monument type sign.

Director Moritz added that the Public Works Department would like to replace this sign with a monochrome electronic LED sign, mounted on a monument base. The base would complement the library building exterior. The messages on the sign would be changed by library personnel on a computer, which would significantly reduce personnel time and would allow the message to be changed more frequently. The sign would be LED, monochrome (2 color), with two lines of text, and some limited graphics. In addition to the ease and speed in changing the message, this would eliminate the possibility of the public changing the sign, perhaps inappropriately, as the sign would now be within easier reach of non-staff persons. The brightness of the sign can be reduced in the evenings, but the sign would be located away from any residential homes that might be affected by the illumination of the sign.

- 2. Upon joint agreement, Staff presents ordinance at public hearing w/recommendation.
- 3. Recommendations from the hearing come back to Committee.
- 4. Committee works w/staff and legal on 2nd draft.
- 5. If 2nd draft merits second hearing, Committee Chairperson will lead that hearing.
- When the Committee agrees by majority vote, ordinance can be sent to Council.

City Manager Kelly Kuenstler stated that Staff needs direction from Council as to whether or not to proceed with drafting a new ordinance for this item.
